"Balsam Project"

The "Balsam Project", established by the Arab Women's Association in Austria has done 4 projects till today.

These projects are conducted with Syrian children and women refugees in Antakya, Turkey. In this climate of insecurity, families are exposed to violence, fear, health problems and safety risks.

In an effort to alleviate the pressure families are facing, as well as to advocate for their needs, "Balsam Project" has trained instructors to raise awareness around different problems the refugees are confronted with. The workshops were focused on: rape and sexual harassment, forced marriage, danger of drugs and their impact and the incurred psychological problems, painting/music/theatre workshops and sport with rehabilitation against violence.

In addition, workshops on non-violent communication and social peace in order to promote a culture of tolerance and respect for others were organised.

Furthermore, "Balsam Project" helped to open an Arabic school in Yayladagh, establish a special clinic for women in one of the Syrian rehabilitation centres in Antakya, and rent two houses in Antakya (cost-shared with other NGOs) – one to host Syrian female refugees and the other to host young Syrian male refugees.

Recently the project managed to initiate healthy and hygienic living campaigns in Haji Bascha, Turkey.

This project is supported by specialists, experts in different subjects and by young volunteers from all over the world. Because this project is still ongoing and attempts to address the needs of the Syrian refugees, it will need more material or other support to continue in the future.

KOINOBORI*-PROJECT

*[koi | koi | (koi carp), noun, a common carp of a large ornamental variety, originally bred in Japan. ORIGIN early 18th cent.: from Japanese, 'carp.']

Japan – Austria – Syria

Koinobori – is a Japanese children's day celebration where colorfully painted fabric koi fish (carp) are hoisted on bamboo poles. The koi fish is able, according to a Chinese legend, to jump against the flow of the waterfall upstream. It symbolises the healthy and vigorous growth of the child.

The Koinobori project was founded in the 2011/2012 Winter by the artist duo Pinepine in Fukushima, Japan and the culture communication platform Kokemoos.

Koinobori is aimed at everyone – but especially those people whose life is currently marked with suffering. The political disaster in Syria and the tsunami and radiation victims in Japan Fukushima, Miyagi are two current examples of those difficulties in which people have to struggle every day. Koinobori project is dedicated to these people.

Everybody experiences some form of problems or difficulties, even in Western countries such Austria.

The results of the collaborative project work from the visited locations, will be presented in various forms around Vienna, with the aim of expressing, best wishes, solidarity, inspiration and hope, for the rediscovery of a normal life.
